

Questions about Enrollment

When will we know if my child has a spot next school year? Currently enrolled students eligible to return for the 2023-24 SY have priority at enrollment and will receive contracts by the end of January. New student applications will be considered after returning student contracts are due, with priority given to siblings of returning students and those interested in AfterCare. New student contracts will be emailed by the end of February.

When will our contract and down payment be due? Once you receive your contract, you will have 10 business days to submit the contract and the non-refundable down payment (10% of tuition).

What if we are not offered a spot in a class we are interested in? Is there a waitlist? If you are not offered a spot in your first choice, you will be offered a spot in your second. You may decline that contract and ask to be placed on the waitlist for your first choice. If we are unable to offer you a spot in any class, we will keep your application on file and keep your child on a waitlist for all interested classes.

What happens if we enroll and then we change our minds? Contracts are for the full school year regardless of attendance. If, however, you decide to withdraw before the start of the year *and we can fill your child's spot*, we will forgive the remaining balance on your contract. Down payments are non-refundable.

We have two children we would like to enroll. Is there a sibling discount? There is a \$200 sibling discount on every second or subsequent child enrolled simultaneously in The Nature Preschool. This discount will be reflected on your contracts.

We love your program, but the tuition is simply out of reach for our family. Do you offer any financial assistance? Yes we do! The [Woodpecker Tuition Assistance Program \(TAP\)](#) offers financial assistance of up to 40% of tuition and Before/AfterCare balances after the down payment. You must complete the **TAP application and submit all relevant documentation by Jan. 9** to be considered for assistance.

Questions Related to the Class Structures

Why isn't there a stand-alone 5-day class? Space limitations! Maryland requires all licensed programs to have an approved classroom for each class. Currently, we do not have a third classroom available. But if you enroll your child in 5 *full* days (a 3-day class and a 2-day class), they will have some friends that are consistent across the two classes and at least one consistent teacher.





Who will my child's teachers be? Class teachers are announced in the summer when families receive Welcome Packets. However, all classes always have two teachers, providing a staff-to-child ratio of no more than 1:7. All teachers have studied either education, child development, or an environmental science and have background checks. At times, classes may have an additional aide or college intern resulting in even lower ratios. We love our dedicated staff!

Are classes really mostly outdoors? Yes! We thrive outside! Classes go in for bathroom breaks and during inclement weather. Full-day classes generally have lunch outdoors (weather permitting) but rest time indoors.
















What do you consider inclement weather? “There’s no such thing as bad weather- only bad clothing!” We go out despite the heat, cold, rain, and snow. We come indoors during lightning and thunder and during periods of sustained extreme temperatures (especially if combined with wet conditions). During strong winds Irvine may close its trails and we may need to move part of our day indoors due to sharing the limited non-trail space with all of Irvine’s programs.

What is the daily schedule like? Because we truly believe in meeting each child’s needs and honoring the child, we do not follow a rigidly set schedule, but more of a daily rhythm. Please see below for the flow of a typical day.

Questions related to COVID-19

What will the COVID precautions be? At this point it is too soon to tell! For now, you can see our current COVID-19 precautions and guidelines on our website.

Will these guidelines change? They are very likely to change. But as always, we will follow local and federal recommendations and do all we can to keep our community reasonably safe. Updated guidelines will be shared with you prior to the start of the school year.

Questions about Before and AfterCare

What is Early Bird Care? Families may drop their children off 30 min early (at 8:30) for a nominal fee. Children spend this time with a preschool staff member in short activities or visiting the animals in the exhibit hall so that parents can get to work or another school drop off.

What will Fern Club AfterCare be like? Two AfterCare teachers will accompany children on even more outdoor adventures and provide ample opportunities to explore music, art, movement, yoga, and play! We will also provide a snack and be back at the upstairs classroom before it gets dark for pick up at 5pm.

I need AfterCare, but not until 5pm. Can I pick up early? Yes! Parents will be able to pick up children earlier through prior arrangements with teachers. However, Fern Club is offered at a flat rate, regardless of when children are picked up.

We are not sure if we want to sign up for Early Bird Care or Fern Club AfterCare yet. Can we sign up later? Yes! But please let us know as soon as possible so that we can plan accordingly!

Will Early Bird Care and Fern Club be available on an occasional basis? Yes, but you must contact The Nature Preschool at least two business days before to ensure space is available. Please note, the cost for “drop-in” care is higher than on-going care.

Can a child who is enrolled in half-day preschool attend Fern Club? No, Fern Club, which begins at 2pm, is only for full-day students.

What about the school calendar? A draft of the calendar will be included with your initial contract. A finalized calendar will be included in the Welcome Packet sent over summer.

Who else will be in my child’s class? We will send a tentative class list in the Welcome Packet.

What gear does my child need? A full Recommended Gear List is provided in the Welcome Packet, but all students will need appropriate outdoor gear, including rain wear, boots, and snow suits. Irvine offers an Adventure Apparel Program from which families can borrow gear for the year.

Will there be any open houses or tours? We host tours every second Thursday of the month at 9:30am. To sign up please complete this [online registration form](#).
